What is the story of the Santa Cruz River watershed, past, present, and future?

Follow the Santa Cruz River north, learning from local experts in Nogales, Tumacacori, Canoa Ranch and Tucson's Mission Gardens about the role of the river in our region's history, hydrology, and culture.

Systems thinking frameworks and tools will be highlighted demonstrating how students of all ages can build and deepen their understanding of any subject. Follow-up sessions and homework will allow for time for collaborating with other educators and developing a plan for how you'll apply your learning in the classroom.
